

Our Family-Community Engagement Specialist has developed an engagement calendar with fun and meaningful events for the school year. Activities include parent book clubs, workshops, family gatherings. She's been essential in developing our weekly blog that serves as a conduit between teachers and families. The biggest benefit to more frequent communication has been increased transparency and therefore, greater trust in our staff, leading to. More buy-in increases engagement, including volunteering. Because BBSD's total enrollment is less that 80, we are "released from setting LPGT".

During the 2023-24 school year, our greatest challenge was engaging families who live outside our district. Because they don't live close to the school, it's more challenging to join in after school and weekend activities in Camp Sherman. Attendance was lowest with our no-resident students. We need to find ways to engage these families so they feel valuable to and a part of our school community, despite their distance from Camp Sherman. Our FCEC is only 12 hours per week. There is enough work for her to be 20 hours per week!
